



Camp William Penn

Camp William Penn, managed by the Philadelphia Department of Recreation, has been in operation for the past 53 years. Located approximately 100 miles from Philadelphia in the heart of the Pocono Mountains, the camp is situated in a secluded 670-acre forest and features two private lakes.

Camp William Penn is open to children between the ages of 7 and 12. The camp is not recommended for children with physical disabilities. Also, Camp William Penn has a limited number of openings for non-Philadelphia youth.

Camp William Penn offers one four-night encampment and four five-night encampments. Camp availability is on a first come, first serve basis.

All encampments begin on Monday afternoon and end on Saturday morning. The only exception is the first encampment, which is five days long and begins on a Tuesday.

First encampment: July 5 – July 9

Second encampment: July 11 – July 16

Third encampment: July 18 – July 23

Fourth encampment: July 25 – 30

Fifth encampment: August 1 – August 6

The tuition for a 4-night encampment is \$60, and a 5-night encampment is \$70.

The fee includes all meals and transportation to and from the camp.
